
DELACOMBE GARDENING CLUB

Family Connections Let's Play, Learn and Grow in Delacombe

Magic happens when parents, carers and children come together on a Thursday morning for the Play, Learn and Grow playgroup. The playgroup commenced in 2019 and is proud to promote itself as a totally inclusive playgroup where parents and children from all cultures, abilities, backgrounds, orientations and beliefs are welcomed. A recent new mother to the group stated, 'I haven't felt welcomed anywhere else, but as soon as I walked into this group, which was hard for me to do, I felt comfortable and my child was appreciated and has responded well'.

Alison Ford, Child and Family Coordinator from The Salvation Army's Family Connections program, is responsible for the coordination of the Play, Learn and Grow playgroup. Alison says, 'I have noticed true connections building between the parents and also a greater connection to their local communities. It is great to see both parents and children forming trusting relationships whilst participating in meaningful play opportunities'.

Some of the parents attending Play, Learn and Grow, also attend other playgroups throughout the week. One parent stated, 'The difference between Play, Learn and Grow and the other groups I attend, is that Play, Learn and Grow feels like home and my child is more engaged here and I think this is because of the way it is facilitated'.

Play, Learn and Grow provides children with the opportunity for free play with various toys and activities and also includes music, singing, dance and stories within the sessions. Children explore the space, their bodies and interact with other children building social and emotional skills, as well as fine and gross motor and cognitive development. 'This is an amazing playgroup which is truly inclusive. All children and parents are welcomed regardless of ability, which is why we come', stated Megan who enjoys attending Play, Learn and Grow with her son.

Play, Learn and Grow is held on a Thursday morning from 9.30am to 11am at The Salvation Army Delacombe Community Church, 104 Greenhalghs Road, Delacombe. Morning tea is provided for parents, carers and children. The playgroup is free and facilitated by Early Childhood Educators. 

additional floodlights will illuminate the car park by late March. To provide a better experience for all, timers will ensure that the system shuts off late evenings minimising impact on homes backing on to the Reserve. The lighting is part of a wider initiative by the YMCA and the City of Ballarat to improve facilities following the finalisation of the Doug Dean Recreational Reserve Masterplan and has been made possible by a \$8,494 grant from the Department of Justice and Community Safety.



Georgia Savage, the YMCA Ballarat's Healthy Living and Community Recreation Coordinator, said, "We are really excited to be able to deliver a community safety lighting initiative at the Doug Dean Stadium in Delacombe. With hundreds of individuals using the stadium every week for a range of recreational activities, it's great to be able to improve the safety and accessibility of this community venue."

There are further works planned, with the YMCA Ballarat securing funding through the City of Ballarat's Community Program Delacombe and Ballarat Foundation's Delacombe Subfund for the installation of an audio visual display system, which will enhance community events and add to the users' experience.

Please note, if you need to have more than 1 child car restraint fitted/checked, you will need to book multiple appointments.
