The 40th Birthday festivities began with the Chair of the Committee of

It is now offering Before School Care options and will be a great resource when it moves into the new school stadium next term.



It is going to be a busy term for our students with lots of exciting things to look forward to. Our swimming programs are now in full swing and our students are preparing for the upcoming Cross Country and Athletics Carnivals.

Literacy through Art at Ballarat Neighbourhood Centre

The "Kabluum" Mural was unveiled as part of the Ballarat Neighbourhood Centre 40th birthday celebrations. This mural has grown out of the "Literacy through Art" classes held at the Centre late last year. Over an 8 weeks period, students, created individual designs which were hung together to produce a cohesive art piece. Irma Mutuc one of the students, described the project as being an unexpected surprise.

"The idea of a comfortable organized collaboration where I would paint a small area, turned into creating a panel of my own. As a non-artist I was initially daunted by the thought of taking on such an enormous challenge. Looking back on the experience now I view it as one of growth which mirrored my experiences here in the Centre over the last few months. I particularly enjoyed watching our group grow cohesively together. Like a choir our many voices have come together to create something beautiful."

In March last year Irma moved to Ballarat permanently from the Philippines. Due to the COVID restrictions Irma's opportunities to connect with her new community were limited leaving her feeling isolated. Ballarat Neighbourhood Centre gave her the opportunity to integrate and contribute to her new community.



Due to the different lifestyle in Australia Irma has had to learn new skills, which Ballarat Neighbourhood Centre has assisted her with. She spoke particularly highly of her cooking tutor Dave; describing his teaching style as absorption of knowledge through doing.

Irma said, "Connections created in class have moved beyond the classroom into students creating a new family for themselves." Although one of the main reasons for joining BNC was to help her find employment Irma jokes that she is saddened now she has work as it gets in the way of her meeting with her BNC family.

New Stadium for Delacombe Primary School

The new school stadium is progressing well and is on track for the opening in April this year. They are currently plastering many of the internal walls and have almost completed all of the external brickwork. A major landscaping upgrade is about to begin, which will be a real feature for the front of our school. As part of our official opening we are working in conjunction with the Delacombe Chairs Forum to hold an Expo on the 14th of May. This will be an opportunity for all the community to see our new facility and learn more about local groups and organisations in the Delacombe area.




Phoenix P-12 Community College's New Indoor Stadium
